A. WELCOME

(i) Welcome to this special General Meeting of Foundation Expo '88 - on the occasion of the 18th Anniversary of the Closing Ceremony of World Expo '88. Today's eneral meeting is the sixth since the inauguration of the Foundation in April 2004 - where on each anniversary date of the Opening Ceremony - 30 April - and of the Closing Ceremony - 30 October - Foundation Expo '88 celebrates and commemorates World Expo '88 - every six months, with the April Meeting at the former Expo site, the now popular South Bank Parklands, and the October Meeting at the Executive Director's Private Address.

(ii) Today's meeting is special because we are at an interesting time in the history of World Expositions. The post-war era has seen numerous successful World Expositions - both Universal and International Categories - including Brussels '58, Montreal '67, Osaka '70, and Sevilla '92, (in the category of Universal Exposition), and, Tsukuba '85, Vancouver '86, Brisbane '88, Hannover 2000, and Aichi 2005, amongst others. In the next few days the Expositions for the time slots 2012 and 2015 will be decided, and very soon we will see Zaragoza Spain in 2008 (three months International Specialised Exposition), and Shanghai 2010 (six months International Exposition). But, there have been no contenders since Sevilla '92 for a Universal Exposition, either hosted or proposed.

(iii) A new torch being carried by Foundation Expo '88 in not only celebrating and commemorating Brisbane's World Expo '88 - but also celebrating and commemorating Australia at World Expositions - past, present, and future, is that Australia should propose to host a Universal Class Exposition, never before attempted by Australia - and that we should do so in conjunction with an Olympic Games - a joint Universal Exposition and the 32nd Olympiad - coined by the Foundation as an 'exp0lympiad' - in 2020 - the 250th Anniversary of the annexation of Australia for the United Kingdom in 1770 by Captain James Cook, a feat the world has not seen since Paris 1900 and St Louis 1904. A 'mega-event' which we propose to be held every 2 decades - starting with 2020 - a new category of Exposition and Olympiad requiring joint BIE and IOC classification.

(iv) Furthermore, we host this event at a brand new technopolis at the heart of the Australian continent, and at the foot of her most prominent natural landmark - Uluru where commencing in 2018 week-by-week in the lead-up to the expo2020lympiad, 2,000 persons from every nation of earth shall be invited to become new citizens of the City of Uluru - a self-legislating and self-governing international authority and new world capital - setting world-wide standards for technology, law, and information for third millennium earth and beyond.

(v) expo2020lympiad uluru shall be the first Universal Exposition since Sevilla '92, and the first of the third millennium. It beckons us to study Seville, and the other Universal Expositions Brussels '58, Montreal '67, and Osaka '70. Today Foundation Expo '88 pays tribute to Sevilla '92, to the Australia Pavilion at Seville, and the wonderful and epoch-making and epoch-marking visual canvas and acropolis of imagination it brought the world.
